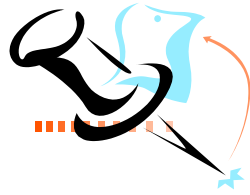

All provided great insight into taxation issues for local communities. The event got front-page coverage from the Livonia Observer, which is always good for the League.

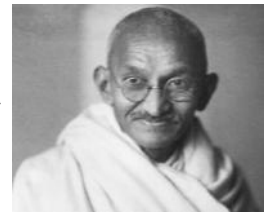
## LEAGUE REGISTERS VOTERS AT SCHOOLCRAFT

## LEAGUE HELP WANTED ON SEVERAL PROJECTS

Westwick Square: As we've done for several years, the League has been asked to handle the Board of Directors election for this Cooperative Housing Development on Annapolis Road in Wayne. ## MICHIGAN IS A LEADER IN VOTE411 USAGE

Our Northwest Wayne County League and the League of Women Voters of Michigan, have been users of VOTE411—the on-line voter guide—for every election since 2012. User activity of this on-line resource grows every election cycle, and the 2016 election was no exception. In 2016, over 6,500 more visitors came to NW Wayne County's VOTE411 pages than in 2014, or a 60% increase. This increase reflects the trend for the general population's movement towards on-line resources instead of depending solely on paper copies of the voter guides. Though we distributed almost 2,000 voter guides to local libraries, we had no reports of shortages (though we expect librarians were careful in how they distributed these guides.)

Our VOTE411 guru this year was Megan Chenoweth, and she did an outstanding job of data collection, meeting deadlines, fielding changes and handling over 140 candidates.

We've already signed up to use VOTE411 again in 2017, which will be primarily for city elections.



## GOVERNMENT FINANCE STUDY

On the frigid night January 5th, the League hosted a panel discussion of municipal leaders to discuss taxation, Michigan revenue sharing, the Headlee amendment and other issues concerning how cities, townships and counties finance services for their residents. This discussion was aimed at helping our members learn more about the LWV Michigan Government Finance Study, and to help us answer the consensus questions at a February 25th member-

ship meeting. About 30 people attended our meeting, including an Observer reporter, David Veselenak, who published a good article a few days later.

Our 3 panelists were all League members: Mayor Susan Rowe from the City of Wayne, Van Buren Township Trustee Sherry Frazier and Wayne County Commissioner Glenn Anderson.

The most riveting testimony was delivered by Susan Rowe, who discussed how the housing crisis which led to massive foreclosures and reduced property values, along with the Headlee amendment and drastic cuts in state funding, created the perfect storm in her community of a financial black hole. The City's pleas for help from the state have gone unanswered, and insolvency is a real possibility in the near future.

With this issue of the Voter, members are also receiving the consensus questions and responses proposed by our local study committee (Rosemary Doyle, Megan Chenoweth, Barbara Miller, Virginia Belinski, Paula Bowman, Nancy White, Gale Arciero, Susan Rowe and Laurie Kelly). Please review this information and bring it with you to the February 25th meeting at the Livonia Library (10:30 am). A presentation with some of the study information will be followed by a discussion of the consensus questions.
